

## GIN FAMILY

All beverages were tested "Neat", but would taste similar with an ice cube.  
An asterisk (\*) denotes what I consider the best all-around "Neat" beverage in this family.  
Those with a hash (#) are worthy considerations within their respective sub-group.

### GIN [juniper flavored agricultural]

# Fleischmann's Extra Dry =  
Moderate burn. Very light juniper flavor. Low proof, developed for use in cocktails.

New Amsterdam No.485 =  
Mild. Strong citrus "fortified lemonade" taste, with the legal minimum of juniper.

Seagram's Extra Dry =  
Different. Mild citrus flavor with a slight whiskey overtone.

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### LONDON GIN [re-distilled grain with juniper]

Beefeater London Dry (english) =  
Burns. Moderate juniper flavor with citrus. Slight mediciney aftertaste.

# Bombay Dry (english) =  
Mild burn. Light juniper and moderate citrus flavor. Lower proof like a Plymouth.

Bombay Sapphire London Dry (english) =  
Burns and tastes mediciney. Flavor of bad herbs with mild juniper overtones.

Coulsons London Dry =  
Moderate burn with detectable cogeners. Light citrus flavor. Usable in a gin punch.

Gordons London Dry =  
Strong sickening lime flavor. Burns. Alcholly, but not mediciney.

\* Tanqueray London Dry (4x, english) =  
Smooth. Flavorful, but domineering. Powerful enough to mask a nasty tonic.

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### GENEVER [re-distilled malt with juniper]

# Bols Genever (dutch) =  
Burns, but easy. Lightly malty with balanced, mild botanicals. Pleasant aftertaste.
